

Aspiring writers dream of having a book published, hoping people will appreciate their literary efforts. So it's a truly special thing when a writer's debut garners rave reviews from both notable publications as well as famous authors. Now, two of these highly praised new authors, Stuart Nadler and Chad Harbach, will visit Milwaukee's very own Boswell Book Company on Thursday, Oct. 20.

Stuart Nadler has written fiction for the Atlantic magazine and is a graduate of the Iowa Writer's Workshop. His newest effort, <u>The Book of Life</u>, is a collection of seven short stories covering topics from extramarital affairs to family estrangement. Even hair loss causes some major angst for the Jewish men in Nadler's stories. The book has gamered praise from authors like Darin Strauss and Frederick Reiken. The Kirkus Review called Nadler a "writer's writer, a fine observer of the nuances and idiosyncrasies of character." Boswell's proprietor, Daniel Goldin, raved, "Nadler's guy heroes seem to have no end of problems in this really smart and powerful collection of stories."


